2024 was a remarkable year for GROW Licking County Community Improvement Corporation, marked by unprecedented milestones and substantial growth. Licking County saw a record-breaking amount of private investment, totaling over \$43 billion. This monumental influx of capital was instrumental in driving various development projects and fostering economic prosperity within the region.

The robust investment translated into significant economic benefits, with payrolls exceeding \$860 million. This surge in payroll not only underscores the thriving business environment but also highlights the positive impact on the household incomes of the residents. The financial health of Licking County has seen a marked improvement, contributing to an enhanced quality of life for many families and businesses who locate here.

GROW Licking County's success has been made possible by our investors and dedicated staff who work in collaboration to bring development guidance to new and existing companies interested in locating in Licking County. This synergy between the public and private sectors has been a driving force behind the region's remarkable achievements. By fostering an environment of cooperation and shared vision, GROW Licking County has effectively leveraged its resources and expertise to create a thriving economic landscape.

GEALAN ESTABLISHES U.S. OPERATIONS IN HEATH

In December, European window manufacturer GEALAN announced plans to establish its U.S. operations in the City of Heath. This \$1.2 million Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) includes a state-of-the-art facility that will create 27 new jobs with an average annual payroll of \$2.16 million.

The Licking County facility will serve as the company's U.S. headquarters, supporting sales, customer service, and training programs to ensure clients benefit from GEALAN's industry expertise and technical support. Known for its advanced European-style window systems, GEALAN is introducing its high-performance products to the North American market.

"Heath is proud to welcome GEALAN to our vibrant business community," said Heath Mayor Mark Johns. "Their decision to make Heath their U.S. manufacturing home underscores the strength of our workforce and infrastructure, while also bringing exciting, world-class products to the American market. This investment highlights our city as a place where both foreign and domestic businesses can thrive and make a global impact."

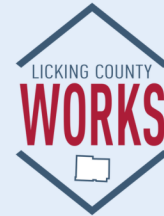


COMMITTEE HIGHLIGHTS

Marketing & Licking County Works

The combined Marketing and Licking County Works committee continued collaborating to promote career pathways resources. Utilizing the Licking County Works manufacturing career pathways video, a digital advertising campaign ran across multiple social media platforms. Due to the campaign's success, we plan to increase our digital advertising in 2025. Additionally, we ran print and digital ads in Livability Licking County and Site Selection Magazine's Workforce Guide and Ohio Business Guide. Infrastructure



Our infrastructure committee aims to leverage relationships to secure funding and advocate for infrastructure improvements. Some of the projects discussed include roadway and safety improvements along the county's major corridors to address current and future needs. Licking County also participated in a 15-county study aimed at fostering collaboration among water and sewer providers.

GROW Licking County and LCATS cohosted the 2nd Annual Licking County Infrastructure Luncheon on June 13th. The event was moved to the Reese Center to accommodate additional guests. With almost 280 attendees, the event featured speakers from ODOT and a panel discussion. Panelists included representatives from LCATS, Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission (MORPC), and The Energy Cooperative.

Site Selectors Guild



Our staff attends the Site Selectors Guild every year to meet 1-on-1 with site selector consultants. This gives us the opportunity to hear directly from consultants what indicators they are looking at when making a decision. Some takeaways from the 2024 conference in Nashville included:

Strategic Plan



In 2018, GROW Licking County adopted an economic growth plan that outlined goals for the organization to reach by the year 2025, including:

- Adding 5,000 new jobs, creating \$200M in new payroll
- Generating \$750M of capital investment
- Raising median household incomes by \$5,000

As of the end of 2024, GROW has exceeded each of these goals. The organization will be undergoing a new strategic planning process to address growth and changes in the community. The process will include stakeholder and community engagement to set new goals for the organization.

Community Engagement

Licking County is a hyper-collaborative community where organizations, businesses, and individuals come together. We are fortunate to have a network of local partners—including government agencies, nonprofits, educational institutions, and private businesses—all working together to support economic development, enhance quality of life, and drive innovation.

TRENDS TO WATCH

Licking County’s economy has experienced significant growth in recent years. Between 2018 and 2023, the population increased by 4.2% and is projected to grow by another 3.7% by 2028. Job growth in the county outpaced the national average, rising by 14.3% compared to the national growth rate of 4.5%. The median household income stands at \$78.5K, surpassing the national median. The county also experiences strong migration inflows, primarily from Franklin County. Overall, Licking County demonstrates positive economic trends with continued job and population growth.

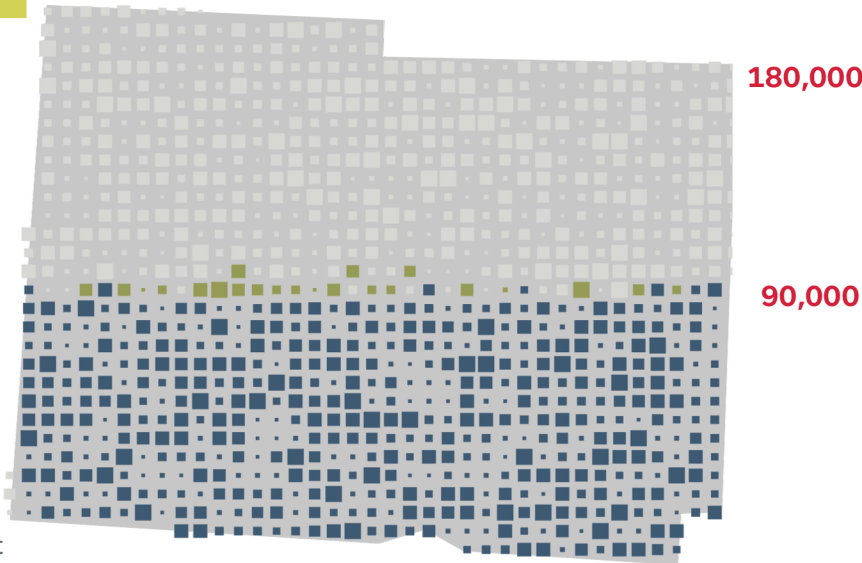
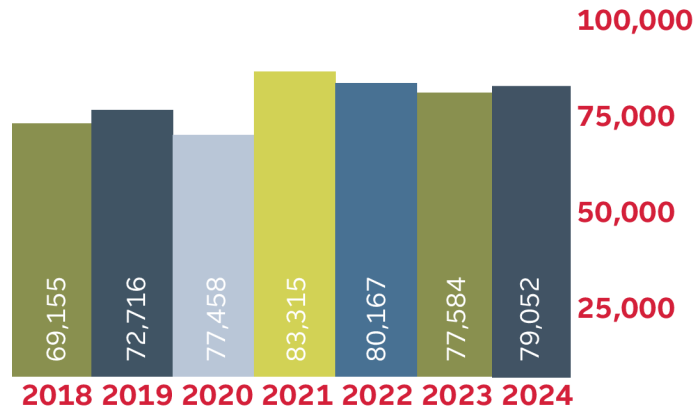
LICKING COUNTY LABOR FORCE

JOB TRENDS

From 2018 to 2024, jobs increased by 14.3% in Licking County from 69,155 to 79,052. This change outpaced the national growth rate of 4.5% by 9.8%.
