WORKFORCE IMPACT



67% of respondents have found it difficult to find childcare

Childcare demands are disrupting our local economy, compelling more than half of our respondents to rethink their employment situation and limiting full-time work opportunities for many households.



56% of respondents have considered leaving their current job due to childcare needs



46% of respondents have someone in their household who is unable to work full-time due to childcare demands

CHILDCARE AFFORDABILITY

Childcare expenses and the modest earnings of childcare providers underscores a systemic issue, threatening both family financial stability and the sustainability of quality childcare.

Based on the median income of Licking County and recommended "affordability" by Health and Human Services* the total weekly cost should be **\$147**

The median hourly wage for childcare workers in Licking County is <u>\$11.88</u> per hour.

This wage is \$2.14 per hour below the ALICE** Household Survival Budget wage of \$14.02 for a singleadult household in Licking County.
